# Adis Patient-Centered Approach

## Patient-physician perspective articles

The first part of this unique article type is authored by the patient, highlighting their experiences. Popular perspectives include challenges in achieving correct diagnosis, finding the right treatment, adverse event management, and the holistic experience of living with a disorder.

The second part is authored by a healthcare professional (often the patient's treating physician), who reflects on the patient experience and what can be learnt from these lived perspectives.
